

About Today's Music: The prelude is by Flemish organist and choir director, Joseph Callaerts (1830-1901). You will hear the lyrical tone in his "Pastorale". Mendelssohn, is one of the leaders of the early Romantic period. Today's solo is based upon Psalm 37 and is found his oratorio, "Elijah". Twentieth century organists and composers Frederick Swann and Gordon Young created arrangements of the tune, St. Anne, which dates from the 1700's.
