

Today in Worship

In order that we might give our full attention to God during worship, we request that you turn off, or turn to silent mode, all cell phones and pagers and that no flash photography be taken.

About Today's Music: Members of the soprano section of our Chancel Choir volunteered to present a favorite anthem this summer. The lyrics are from last Sunday's Old Testament reading, Psalm 42. Two hymns round out our service music. Dan Forrest's modern setting of the familiar hymn, "My Jesus, I Love Thee" is presented by soprano, Cynthia Corso as the prelude feature a less familiar though emphatic statement of the trust we can have in God. The postlude feature the stops of the three keyboards of the FPC organ (the choir - soft, the swell - more colorful, the great - most powerful) in a march by Alphonse Mailly.

About Today's Cover Art: The 'vision' of Paul Gauguin's painting is not literal, but spiritual. In a letter to Vincent van Gogh (September 1888), Gauguin points to the disproportionate smallness of the cow and the wrestlers in relation to the spectators. Such disproportionality signals, he explains, that the scene is taking place in the women's imaginations. And the women do not need physical organs to see a struggle in the imagination. In their encounter with the place named Peniel/Penuel (from the Hebrew panim, face and el, God)—so-called because there Jacob saw God face to face—the eyes of all would-be spectators are closed or obscured from us.
