World Communion Sunday

Every year on the first Sunday in October, on October 1st this year, Christians around the globe celebrate World Communion Sunday. It is a day to remember that Jesus Christ is the Head of the Church and that every Christian Church and any denomination that promotes Christian unity are one. On this day, people draw faith and inspiration from seeing that they are part of a community that boasts millions of believers and worshippers. The tradition was begun in 1933 by Hugh Thomson Kerr who was the pastor of Shadeyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA., and was adopted by the Federal Council of Churches in 1940.

About Today's Music: We celebrate our oneness with believers around the world through World Communion Sunday. "Ave Verum Corpus" - conveys the communion text in music. Today's anthem is a new setting of the John 3:16 text with a sweeping melodic line. The haunting Adagio by Edward Elgar ("Pomp & Circumstance" composer) relates to the mystery of faith. The Chancel Choir presents a new introit and benediction today as the music of the service concludes with Diane Bish's arrangement of "Morning Has Broken" - a folksong given hymn lyrics by British writer, Eleanor Farjeon.
