Today in Worship

In order that we might give our full attention to God during worship, we request that you turn off, or turn to silent mode, all cell phones and pagers and that no flash photography be taken.

The four Sundays before Christmas Day comprise the season of Advent, days which point toward the coming of Christmas in much the same way Lent points toward Easter. In these ever shorter and ever darker days, the progressive lighting of candles on an Advent wreath becomes an enactment of our trust that "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." (John 1:5) The passages read as the candles are lit are the prescribed Old Testament lectionary passages for the day.

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#### This Year's Pageant

Once a year we gather together to hear the familiar story of Christ's birth as told through the voices of our children and youth. The Christmas Pageant is a tradition that has been part of this congregation for decades. In a culture that increasingly devalues history and rituals, the re-telling of a familiar story is an act of resistance to those who would say tradition no longer matters. For story telling has the power to make the familiar unfamiliar to us. Even if we know the words by heart, the act of watching the ancient drama unfold, transports us back to the first time we learned of the baby who was born in a manger because there was no room in the inn. Together, we are caught up with Mary and the Angel Gabriel or the Shepherds and the Magi who behold the shining star. Together, we are once again transformed by the light that the darkness cannot overcome. Finally, together we re-tell the story of our faith and answer the call to worship a God made flesh who has come to live among us. Tradition unites us with all those before and all those to come as we proclaim the good news that hope is alive and peace will come!
