About Today's Music: Today's choral music features the music of two noted female composers. Frances Williams retained her commitment to her native Wales and themes of Welsh hymns as she is a Master's Degree graduate of the Juilliard School, a composer, and an officer of the Manhattan Musicians' Club. Susan LaBarr, was the 2012-2014 Missouri Composer Laureate and at the age of 43 is a sought after composer of commissioned works worldwide. Our organ music features two 20th century composers, Wayne Wold (Professor-Hood University) and J. Bert Carlson (Presbyterian pastor and organist), whose theme of "Christ, the Light of the World" (*Christe Sanctorum*) amplifies the meaning of the season of Epiphany.
