THE TOLLING OF THE BELL

*In the darkness, the bell is tolled 33 times, representing the years of Jesus' life, and the bible is slammed shut, echoing the tomb. The world is bereft of both the Light and the Word.
The congregation departs in silence.*

On Maundy Thursday (also called Holy Thursday), the church commemorates the Last Supper when Jesus broke bread with his disciples for the last time before his arrest and crucifixion. The word *Maundy*, a Middle English usage, derives from the Old French and Latin *mandamentum*, meaning *commandment*. This evening's music reflects the somberness and sadness of the last hours of Christ's life.

The Easter Dawn Service will be held Sunday at Northport Village Park beginning at 7 AM.
In the event of inclement weather, please gather at Trinity Episcopal Church on Main Street.
A light breakfast follows at Trinity Church.

Our Easter worship celebration will take place here in the sanctuary at 10:00 AM. Pre-service music will begin at 9:45 AM.

The service includes communion, special music, and the flowering of the cross.
